

Creative Awards Activities for Schools Key Stage 3

Science

Exploring Ecosystems and Interdependence

Activity: Research and create an infographic or presentation exploring a shared ecosystem, highlighting the roles of both humans and animals (eg. savannahs, rainforests).

LO: The interconnectedness of humans and animals within ecosystems.

Ecosystems and Habitats

All organisms in a food web depend upon each other and changes to one can affect the others.

Activity: Research how human actions (deforestation, urbanization) impact animal habitats.

Then design a 'coexistence plan' to help humans and animals thrive together in a chosen ecosystem, using both scientific data and imaginative solutions.

LO: Shared responsibilities for environmental stewardship.

English

Persuasive Writing

The ethical treatment of animals and humans' responsibilities.

Activity Idea: Use the prompt below to create a lesson, as a persuasive writing opportunity.

Prompt: 'Should animals have the same rights as humans in certain areas of life? Should we have One Medicine in practice?'

Creative Element: Encourage students to include an emotional appeal by sharing stories of humans and animals working together or inspiring change.

Debate Activity

The ethical treatment of animals and humans' responsibilities.

Activity Idea: Use the prompt below to create a lesson, as a debating activity.

Prompt: 'Should animals have the same rights as humans in certain areas of life? Should we have One Medicine in practice?'

Creative Element: Encourage students to include factual information researched on ethics and health research. Based on their learning and debate activity, create a poster or story to show their thoughts on One Medicine.

Art

Human-Animal Hybrids and Symbolism

Focus: Visual storytelling through art, using mixed media techniques.

Theme: 'Humanimal Connections – We Are All Animals'

Create a hybrid creature blending human and animal features, symbolizing and exhibiting shared

traits or roles (e.g., a creature embodying strength and compassion).

Techniques: Pencil sketch, painting, or digital art (Not AI).

Focus on symbolism (eg. a lion-human hybrid representing courage).

Creative Outcome: Create a display of the artwork with an accompanying artist's statement

explaining the symbolic choices and what the hybrid represents.
